IT IS NOT NECESSARY TO ENTER YOUR DOGS FOR THE ALL BREED SHOWS IF YOU WISH TO ONLY ENTER FOR THE OBEDIENCE TRIALS. THE ENTRY FEES FOR OBEDIENCE IS - **Rs.600/-** per class inclusive of catalogue.

Entries can be sent through our website www.madrascanineclub.org. Show schedules & advertisement tariff are available in the website. Exhibitors, enthusiasts and donors may contact the above for advertisements & sponsorships.

The Madras Canine Club will acknowledge receipt of the entry, but nevertheless, it shall also be the duty of the exhibitor to also ascertain that their entries have reached "The Madras Canine Club".

NB: Entry sent by Whatsapp & email will not be accepted under any circumstances. Entry forms received without entry fees will also not accepted under any circumstances. All entry forms should necessarily be accompanied by a xerox copy of the KCI Registration certificate including the reverse side where the transfer of ownership is effected.

AWARDS: At the Madras Canine Club's triple Ch.Dog Shows only Challenge Certificates will be awarded and attractive Trophies and prizes befitting the occasion will be awarded to winners.

ELIGIBILITY: CRYPTORCHID AND MONORCHID DOGS will not be allowed to compete in the breed class and bitches in season will not be allowed to compete at the Obedience Trials.

The Show Committee reserves the right to nominate a new / alternative judge in the event of any of the above mentioned judges not being able to fulfil their obligation and should there be more entries than expected in any group the Show Committee reserves the right to allot a breed or breeds to any other judge in the panel or nominate a new judge in order to finish the show on time. The Show Committee reserves the right to change the order of judging if required and hence exhibitors should bench their dogs on time.

Dogs would be judged simultaneously in all the rings and the order of judging would be notified later. Exhibitors are hence requested to have sufficient number of handlers should they have more than one breed and also bench their dogs close to the rings where they are being judged.

Exhibitors are requested to note that exhibit numbers will not be called over the public address system and hence they will have to follow the show catalogue and programme sheet and be present in the ring on their own. The Club shall not be held responsible if exhibitors are not present in the ring when their class is being judged. Exhibitors are requested to dress themselves suitably. It is advised that exhibitors must wear shoes when they are handling their dogs.

CAUTION: Exhibitors should make themselves familiar with the KCI Rules and Regulations for Shows, copies of which may be obtained from the KCI on payment of **Rs.100/-**. Exhibitors are cautioned that an entry in the wrong Class or Breed will disqualify the exhibit automatically.

CHALLENGE CERTIFICATE: Challenge and Reserve Challenge Certificates will be awarded at the Show (CCs & Res.CCs). All Indian Breeds are eligible for CCs. As per KCI rules Reserve CCs will not be taken into consideration for computing Championship status.

PENALTY: Any wilful misrepresentations regarding ownership, age, name, pedigree, etc. of dogs entered and/or prepared for exhibition in contravention of the KCI Regulations, will be liable for disciplinary action by the Committee.

Note: Dogs that are not present in the ring when their classes are being judged will be deemed to have been absent.

OBJECTIONS: Objections will be decided by the Madras Canine Club Committee in accordance with the KCI Regulations. The objection fee is Rs.2000/- returnable if the objection is upheld by the Show Committee and forfeited if the objection is rejected.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: As per new KCI Rules All dogs who have obtained 4 CCs under 4 different Judges are entitled to be called Champions provided the dog has obtained the 4th CC after the age of 12 month and irrespective of whether a 'Champion' certificate has been issued to the dog or not.

As per the rule a dog with 3 CCs entered at a twin Show can become a 'champion' in Ring I, as soon as the 4th CC is awarded at the first of the two shows. Contrary to the earlier rule which has now been amended, a dog that has obtained the 4th CC at the first of the two shows organized on the same day, the exhibit should be continued to be shown in the same class it has been entered prior to it becoming a Champion. Nevertheless if the dog has been entered at a subsequent shows at a later date, it is compulsory that the dog should be entered in the Champion Class only even though the dog may have been entered in any other class.

Exhibitors may note that all puppies would have to be entered only in the Puppy class as per the KCI Rules.

Further please note that all exhibits eligible to compete for the Best in Show line up shall only be such exhibit that have won a BOB / RBOB as a Champion or won a CC with BOB or RBOB. A non-champion winning the Best of Breed without a Challenge Certificate is not eligible to participate in the group judging or Best in Show line up. As per the KCI directive the I I Group system will be followed and the rule of picking 21 dogs in the line up will be followed. Indian breeds have been classified as a separate group and classified as Group-I I.

It has been decided to classify Indian Breeds as a separate group and will henceforth be classified as Group Eleven - Indigenous breeds. The first two dogs chosen in this group will be sent for the BIS line up. Contrary to the earlier norm of having 19 dogs in the line up, 21 dogs would be chosen for the line up of which as usual only 8 dogs would get placed.

Exhibitors are prohibited from wearing T-shirts or shirts bearing the name or logo of their Kennel. Those contravening this rule will not be permitted to enter the ring. Exhibitors are requested to read the definition of classes and enter their exhibits in the correct class.

IMPORTANT NOTICE:

Exhibitors may note that the dog show is being held outdoors and the Madras Canine Club (MCC) will not be responsible for vagaries of the weather, such as rain or excessive heat. Should the show get stopped owing to reasons beyond their control such as excessive rain or heat or other unforeseen circumstances such as public strike, vandalism, etc., the Madras Canine Club will not hold itself responsible and will not refund the entry fee to any exhibitor or for any financial damages or otherwise the exhibitor may have suffered in the process.

Exhibitors / handlers are hereby warned that any one found drinking or drunk inside the show ground or while handling the exhibit in the show ring will be reported to the KCI. Such persons are liable to be suspended for a minimum period of two years and shall also be fined Rs.1000/-

Exhibitors to Note: Exhibitors to ensure that the microchip that has been passed on to them along with the registration certificates is properly implanted into the dog. **Dogs without microchip will not be permitted at the show.**

As per the recent KCI directive DOUBLE HANDLING is strictly prohibited. Such of those who resort to double handling inspite of this will automatically entitle the removal of the particular exhibit from the show ring.

ENFORCEMENT & AMENDMENT OF RULES: The decision of the MCC Show Committee is final subject only to appeal to KCI. Should questions arise which are not provided for in the rules the Committee's decisions will be final and binding. Any breach of the Rules and/or KCI Regulations will render the exhibitor liable to disciplinary action by the Committee. Exhibitors are also liable for any damage done by them or their servants or their dogs. The Committee, reserves the right to refuse or accept any entry without assigning any reason whatsoever.

VET-EXAMINATION: All dogs must be checked and their microchip scanned and passed by the Honorary Veterinary Surgeon, present at the gate and be certified fit by him before admission. The Veterinary certificate should be produced at the Waiting ring to the Waiting Ring Stewards.

C-3 NOVICE: 1. Temperament Test 2. Heel on Lead 3. Heel Free 4. Recall from sit or down 5. Retrieve a dumb bell 6. Sit one minute, handler in sight 7. Down two minutes handler in sight.

C-4 TEST A: 1. Heel on lead 2. Temperament test 3. Heel free 4. Recall from sit or down position 5. Retrieve a Dumb bell 6. Sit one minute. Handler in sight 7. Down five minutes. Handler out of sight 8. Scent Discrimination.

C-5 TEST B Graduate: 1. Heel Free 2. send away, Drop and Recall 3. Retrieve any one article provided by the Judge 4. Stand one minute 5. Sit two minutes, handler out of sight 6. Down ten minutes, handler out of sight 7. Scent Discrimination.

C-6 TEST C Open: 1. Heel work 2. Send away, Drop and Recall 3. Retrieve any one article 4. Distant control 5. Sit two minutes, handler out of sight 6. Down ten minutes, handler out of sight 7. Scent Discrimination.

C-7 COMPANION DOG: 1. Heel on Lead 2. Stand for examination 3. Heel Free 4. Recall 5. Long sit 6. Long down.

NOTE:

1. Dog participating in Test "C" shall not be entered in any other class except Companion Dog Class.
2. A dog can be entered only in 2 Classes apart from Companion Dog Class
3. Bitches in season are not allowed to compete for Obedience.
4. A dog could be entered in Obedience classes without being entered in the Breed Classes.
5. Challenge Certificates will be awarded to all dogs irrespective of sex who have obtained 290 marks and above at test "C" open.

EXTRACTS FROM K.C.I. REGULATION FOR SHOWS:

Not be used as a name or part of the name in connection with any Classes other than as defined therein.

a) CHAMPION CLASS is one in which all dogs that have attained their championship title on the day of sending the entries may compete.

b) OPEN CLASS is one in which all dogs of that breed or variety of breed may compete.

c) B.I. CLASS is a class in which only dogs, bred and begotten in India, shall be eligible, Dogs begotten abroad and born in India or on the voyage out, are imported, dogs under Regulations for Registrations.

d) INTERMEDIATE CLASS is one in which dogs that are 19 months of age and not exceeding 36 months on the first day of the show can compete.

e) JUNIOR CLASS is one in which dogs that are 13 months of age and not exceeding 18 months on the first day of the show may be entered.

f) PUPPY CLASS is one in which dogs that are 7 months of age and not exceeding 12 months on the first day of the show be entered.

g) MINOR PUPPY CLASS is one in which dogs that are 4 months of age and not exceeding 6 months on the first day of the show be entered.

3.A dog imported from abroad shall be eligible to be entered in any class that they are eligible for.

4.A dog may be entered in Obedience Class only without being entered in any of its Breed Classes.

5. Special Prizes: No dog shall be eligible to compete for the special prize until it has been judged in its Breed Class or Classes or if it has been beaten in its Breed Class or Classes by another or either sex, eligible and compete for the special prize.

JUNIOR HANDLING COMPETITION:

19th January 2025 (Sunday) at 6.00 p.m

There would also be a Junior Handling Competition in the show. Those wishing to participate must be in the age group of 12 to 16 proof of which should be sent along with the entry form for Junior handling. The Junior handler should be in a position to handle his/her own dog and also a different dog that would be given to them at the show grounds.

Know your Judges

Mrs. Barbara Muller, Switzerland



Grown up with Newfoundland's and German Shepherd's, dogs have been part of my life ever since. At the age of 8 years, I started to go to training classes with "my" first German Shepherd and since then the Dog World became more and more important for me.

The first English Cocker Spaniel arrived in my house in 1970 and 1973 I started breeding Spaniels, followed by Old English Sheepdogs and Petit Basset Griffon Vendéen under the "Pennylane" prefix. Many National and International Champions, European Winner and World Winners were bred, trained and

also handled by me.

In 1980 I was confirmed by the Swiss Kennel club (SKG) as a judge and since 2012 I am approved to judge all FCI breeds. Since 2006 I am a member of the Swiss Kennel Club board and President of the Judges- and Show Commission. In 2010 I became a member of the FCI Europe Section Committee, and have been the vice-president for many years. From 2014 to 2019 I have been the President of the FCI Show Commission and in 2019 I became a member of the FCI General Committee.

In most European Countries, Africa, Asia, Australia, South America, England and USA I have judged many times, this includes numerous National Specialties, Section Winner- and several World Dog Shows.

I feel very honoured to be invited to judge in Chennai and look forward to the show events and the dogs in India with great pleasure.

Mrs. Donne Lucas, South Africa,



My name is DONNE LUCAS, and I currently reside in Stellenbosch, Western Cape, SOUTH AFRICA. I speak, read, and write 3 languages, namely English, Afrikaans and Xhosa and have a small understanding of Dutch and German. I am medically fit, healthy. I have been incredibly fortunate to have had several immensely knowledgeable mentors during my career and firmly believe that one is never too old to learn and continued education on all Breeds is important for me.

I first qualified to officiate and award CC in 1994 and have been judging at championship level. My first FCI qualification hence from 1996. I am a licensed FCI INTERNATIONAL and KUSA ALL BREEDS JUDGE, including BIS and Handler Classes. My qualifications also extend to the working side as I am licensed to Judge APTITUDE Tests as well as Dog Jumping and Agility.

I breed, work, and show Dobermanns and have Miniature Schnauzer. In 2008 I bred the Chaldonne C litter which produced my famous INT CH, MULTI CH, CHALDONNE

CHEKPOINTCHARLI ZTPVIA - European Winner 2011.A multi Best in Show and Multi Specialist Best In Show winner with her Breed Suitability test qualification ZTPVIA.

Charli and I travelled to Europe many times within the boundaries of the countries regulations of only being allowed a temporary permit to be out of South Africa for 10 days at a time. She gained her International Championship title, as well as Club Winner in Holland at the DVIN, European Winner 2011 and a reserve BEST IN SHOW in Europe. She also titled Champion in 10 Countries. Other Countries she qualified in points but needed to complete Championship with their Breed Tests, but sadly our legislation and timing did not allow.

I have Judged in Norway, Belgium, Estonia, Greece, Reunion Island (France), Macedonia, Bulgaria, Israelreland,Kenya,Brazil, Uzbekistan,Indonesia, Thailand, Philippines, China, India,Australia,Tasmania and South Africa. Including Dobermann Specialist Clubs Europe, Indonesia, Brazil, South Africa, and the inauguration show of Dobermann Pinscher club of India.

I served as a committee member on the South African National Breed Judges Association and was Chairperson for the Provincial Judges Committee for the Eastern Cape. The National and Provincial Judges sub committees have been decentralised now to Gauteng and I am now serving as Judging Assessor and Mentor. Not only as a judge, but I have also exhibited and handled my own dogs in excess of 15 countries around the world and attended many more dog shows abroad just as a spectator and learner.

I am a founder Director of Dobermann Rescue South Africa which is a registered Non-Profit Organisation which offers a second chance to Dobermanns that need new homes. My interests include travel, horse riding, gardening and craft.

Mr. Robert L. T. Dawson, Bangkok, Thailand



Bob Dawson is an Australian who has worked in the Asia and the Pacific region for over 45 years. Initially based in Manila Philippines, then Seoul, South Korea and now in Bangkok, Thailand.

Bob has concentrated on Toy and Companion dogs (Pugs, Chihuahua, Japanese Chins and Boston Terriers) and Hounds (Basenji, Miniature Dachshund, and Whippets) breeding and campaigning many to their Philippine Grand Champions and Champions. He has also made-up AKC Champions. His dogs have won many Best in Shows and have been in many internationally recognized lines. His kennel prefix is "Kawana". He was the

first person to introduce Boston Terriers and Basenjis to the Philippines. He has judged on all six continents, including in Australia and New Zealand; South Africa, Brazil, several countries in Europe including Finland, Switzerland, Latvia, Ireland, Russia, Germany, England, and Sweden; in the United States and Canada, and in most of the countries in Asia including India, Thailand, Indonesia, Singapore, Malaysia, South Korea, Japan and the Philippines. He has officiated at many specialties, as well as Dog of the Year competitions in Australia, South Africa, Europe, and Asia.

Mr. Dawson has been a Director on the Board of the Philippine Canine Club Inc., (PCCI)

the parent canine body in the Philippines and is a life member of that organization. He has conducted seminars for judges and exhibitors in several countries and has been active in the administration of clubs, including the Pug Club of the Philippines, the Boston Terrier Club of the Philippines, and the Hound Group Club of the Philippines. He has been involved in the development and implementation of Judges' Training Schemes.

Ms.Suncica Lazic, Belgrade



Suncica Lazic an All Breeds Judge was born in Belgrade (Serbia) and is a Management graduate and has had dogs since her childhood days and dogs have always occupied a large part of her life and they always will. Since then he has bred and owned Lhasa Apso's, Beagles, Cocker Spaniels, Boxers, GSD's, British Bulldogs Dobermans, Dachshund Std Smooth, Fox Terriers, Whippets, Scottish Terrier & Pugs under the prefix "Magic Million"

A keen exhibitor for the last 40 years he has exhibited his dogs at almost every show in India making champions of most of the dogs that he owned. In 1986 he campaigned his Standard Smooth Dachshund "Ch.Sans

Craintes To Reckon With” a Bred in India dog which went to win 36 CC’s including several Best in Shows and this became his first Dog of the Year. He subsequently campaigned his Doberman “Ch.Sans Craintes Magic Million” which was adjudged Dog of the Year Bred in India for two consecutive years 1990 & 1991 and winning 35 CC’s and 11 Best in Shows. His Std Smooth Dachshund bitch “Ch.Magic Million Crystal Eye” was adjudged Puppy of the Year in 1993.

The year 1994 again proved to be a lucky year for him. His Doberman once again Imported from Japan “Ch.Rising Star of Harase Garten” was again adjudged Dog of the Year for the show season 1994 winning 10 continuous Best in Shows and 2 Reserve Best in Shows. Once again his home bred “Ch.Magic Million’s Chocolate Drop” a multi Best in Show winner was declared Best in Show at the most Prestigious Kennel Club of India’s Centenary Dog Show judged by Mrs. Ann Argyle from UK. This has been the largest show till date ever organized by the Kennel Club of India. Ch.Magic Million’s Chocolate Drop also went to become the Reserve Dog of the Year for the Year 1995-96. After a break of three years the kennel commenced exhibiting dogs once again and his Doberman import Ch.Harmonic Glory Joice went to become the Top Doberman in the country and also the Reserve Dog of the Year winning several Best in Shows. In 2003-2004 he campaigned yet another Doberman Ch.Right Staff of Harase Garten imported from Japan, which was again adjudged Dog of the Year. C.V.Sudarsan holds the distinction of being the first exhibitor in India to have won all the five major trophies instituted by the Kennel Club of India.

Mr.Sudarsan has had the distinction of having judged every club show in India and has also judged in all the five continents. He has judged shows at the United States, United Kingdom, Canada, Philippines and at every state in Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Japan, China, Nepal, Norway, Malaysia, Thailand, Indonesia, Korea, Argentina, South Africa, Taiwan, Russia, Mexico, Slovakia Romania, Puerto Rico, Israel, Slovenia, Hungary, Holland, Germany, Colombia, Brazil, Latvia, Guatemala, Ukraine, Netherland, Switzerland, Cyprus and Luthvenia.

Some of the important shows that he has judged include the Brisbane Royal in Australia on two occasions, the Queensland Classic, the Belconnan Autumn International Festival, Australasian Show Dog of the Year, Tasmania Kennel Club’s Centenary show, Calcutta Kennel Club’s Centenary show, the Lower Mainland Kennel Club show in Canada, the Goldfield Kennel Club show in South Africa and the Contest of Champions in UK on two occasions. Mr.Sudarsan has judged at Six World dog shows at Mexico, Bratslavia, Hungary, Russia, Amsterdam and Germany and the European Show in Holland. He reached the pinnacle of his judging career when he was invited to judge at the Eukanuba World Challenge held in Florida in the year 2011 and which is considered as one of America’s premier dog show. At the Eukanuba World Challenge, the same Lhasa Apso that he had put up in the Section went to win the Best in Show at Crufts the World’s largest show 3 months later. Once again in May 2013 he was invited to judge at the World Dog Show in Budapest, Hungary and had the honour of judging Group-9 which is considered the most prestigious group where he put up a Lhasa Apso from Finland for the Group. The same Lhasa Apso went to win the Reserve Best in Show at the World Dog Show.

Mr.C.V.Sudarsan obtained his All Breeds Judging License in 1984 and has been judging ever since and is on the panel of the Asian Kennel Union and FCI Judges and was the Founder Secretary of the Madras Canine Club which post he held for about 30 years and is now currently the President of the Madras Canine Club and also the President of the Doberman Pinscher Confederation of India. His association with the Kennel Club of India dates back to more than four decades and has been on the Executive Committee for the last 38 years and is currently the Hony. Secretary & Treasurer of the Kennel Club of India and is also the Editor of the prestigious Indian Kennel Gazette, which is the official publication of the Kennel Club of India for 30 years in a row. He is also the President of the Kodaikanal Kennel Association.

Mr. J. Rangarajan, India



J.Rangarajan is born in a dog loving family and evinced great interest in training dogs right from his young age. He was only 14 when he trained his first dog. He has won many awards in Obedience Trials at the various dog shows. In the year 1988 he started Woodstock Dog Training School at Chennai and the services from his institution are well sought after. In the same year he was granted License by the Kennel Club of India to judge Obedience Trials and since then he has judged shows extensively. In the year 2001 Rangarajan migrated to USA with his family and he opened a branch of Woodstock in USA. He

worked as a Vice President in a private Security company heading the Canine Security Division.

He also worked part time at four different stores of Petco at Chicago as Canine Education Instructor running group Obedience Training Classes. He is an approved Canine Good Citizen Evaluator by the American Kennel Club. From the year 2008 Rangarajan has been spending time in India as well as USA in looking after his Business at both the places. In the year 2009 Rangarajan was appointed by Tamil Nadu Government to Train dogs for Search and Rescue work for the Tamil Nadu Fire and Rescue Services. This is the first ever Search and Rescue Service Dog Squad in the country. The SAR Dogs Training program was completed in 2011 and the SAR Dogs are in active service in Tamil Nadu State.

Rangarajan is one of the founder member of the Madras canine Club and been a member of the Kennel Club of India for close to three decades. Rangarajan is a Member of the following Professional Organisations.:
